TSANZ Program Features

WUNDERLY ORATOR

Professor Warwick Britton, University of Sydney, NSW

Warwick Britton is a clinical immunologist who is recognised as an international authority on the immunology of infectious diseases. Professor Britton has made extensive contributions to the study of mycobacterial infections over the last 20 years. After graduating from the University of Sydney, he trained in Sydney, Melbourne and Liverpool before working in a rural hospital in Nepal, where he became fascinated by leprosy and tuberculosis. After completing a PhD on the immunology of leprosy, he established the Mycobacterial Research Laboratory in Kathmandu from 1986-89 for the study of human immune responses to *Mycobacterium leprae*. This continues as a major field centre for the study of leprosy. He then joined Faculty of Medicine and is currently the Bosch Chair of Medicine and the Head of the Disciplines of Medicine and Infectious Diseases & Immunology in the Central Clinical School. Over the last 15 years he has been the Head of the Mycobacterial Research Group at the Centenary Institute, with an emphasis on the study of *M. tuberculosis* infection over the last 10 years. His studies have spanned the definition of mycobacterial antigens, including the first *M. leprae* specific protein, the first isolation of a mycobacterial heat shock protein 70, and the major membrane protein of *M. leprae*, the cloning and manipulation of mycobacterial genes, the characterisation of human and mouse host responses to mycobacterial infections, including the roles of the cytokines, LT_α and TNF, in mycobacterial infections, and the development of recombinant mycobacterial, viral and DNA vaccines against tuberculosis and leprosy. He has recently edited the Immunology volume of a new definitive Handbook of Tuberculosis with Professor SHE Kaufmann, Max Plank, Berlin. He has additional research interests in the cellular immune responses in allergic disease, and the epidemiology of asthma. In 2002-03 he was recipient of one of two Fulbright Senior Scholar Awards for Australia to work at the National Institutes of Health in Bethesda MD. This has led to a number of ongoing collaborative research projects. In 2004 he was the recipient of the RPAH Research Foundation medal for medical research.

KEYNOTE SPEAKERS



Professor Kalpalatha (Kay) Guntupalli, USA

Kalpalatha K. Guntupalli, MD, FCCP, is a Professor and Chief, Pulmonary/Critical Care and Sleep Section, at the Baylor College of Medicine in Houston, TX. She completed her internal medicine residency at DC General Hospital and pulmonary and critical care fellowships at Georgetown University and the University of Pittsburgh, respectively. She served on the faculty at the University of Pittsburgh and Emory University prior to joining Baylor in 1988. Dr Guntupalli has served ACCP in many capacities, including Regent-at-Large; Chair of the Critical Care Institute; Chair of Women's Health NetWork; member of the CHEST Program Committee; and trustee of The CHEST Foundation, and is currently ACCP President-Elect. She serves as The CHEST Foundation's Second Distinguished Scholar in Critical Care Medicine. Her academic interests include ARDS and critical care education tools. She has developed anti-tobacco education material in seven languages and anti-tobacco cartoons for children in three languages, inspiring more than 200,000 children. Dr Guntupalli believes in fostering a culture of a "global family" of health caregivers to deliver the best of care to all patients and make meaningful contributions to society.





Professor Stephen Holgate, University of Southampton, UK

Stephen Holgate is Medical Research Council Clinical Professor of Immunopharmacology at the University of Southampton, UK. His clinical and research interests are in the mechanisms and treatment of asthma and allied disorders. This has spanned epidemiology, immunology, pharmacology, experimental medicine and genetics.

Notable contributions have been in defining inflammatory and remodelling processes in asthma as they relate to different clinical phenotypes, identification of ADAM33 as the first novel asthma susceptibility gene and the mechanisms of acute exacerbations and the use of novel biologicals in therapy. On a broader front he chairs the Population and Systems Medicine Board of the MRC and am a member of the MRC's Strategy Board and the UK Government's Translational Medicine Board. He has a particular interest in promoting Respiratory and Allergy Research, in increasing the translation of scientific discovery into patient benefit and the impact of the environment on human health.



Professor Jeffrey Whitsett, Cincinnati Children's Hospital Medical Center, USA

Jeffrey A Whitsett, MD, is Executive Director of the Perinatal Institute, and Chief of the Section of Neonatology, Perinatal and Pulmonary Biology at Cincinnati Children's Hospital Medical Center in Cincinnati, OH. Dr. Whitsett's research focuses to various aspects of pulmonary medicine. He made seminal contributions in identification of surfactant

proteins and elucidation of their structures, functions, genes and their regulation. His research interests include elucidation of the signaling and transcriptional mechanisms determining lung morphogenesis, structure and function in health and disease. He has contributed to the identification of mutations in genes causing lung disease in newborn infants and children, including those regulating surfactant function and clearance. These genes are also involved in the pathogenesis of pulmonary fibrosis, and pulmonary alveolar proteinosis.

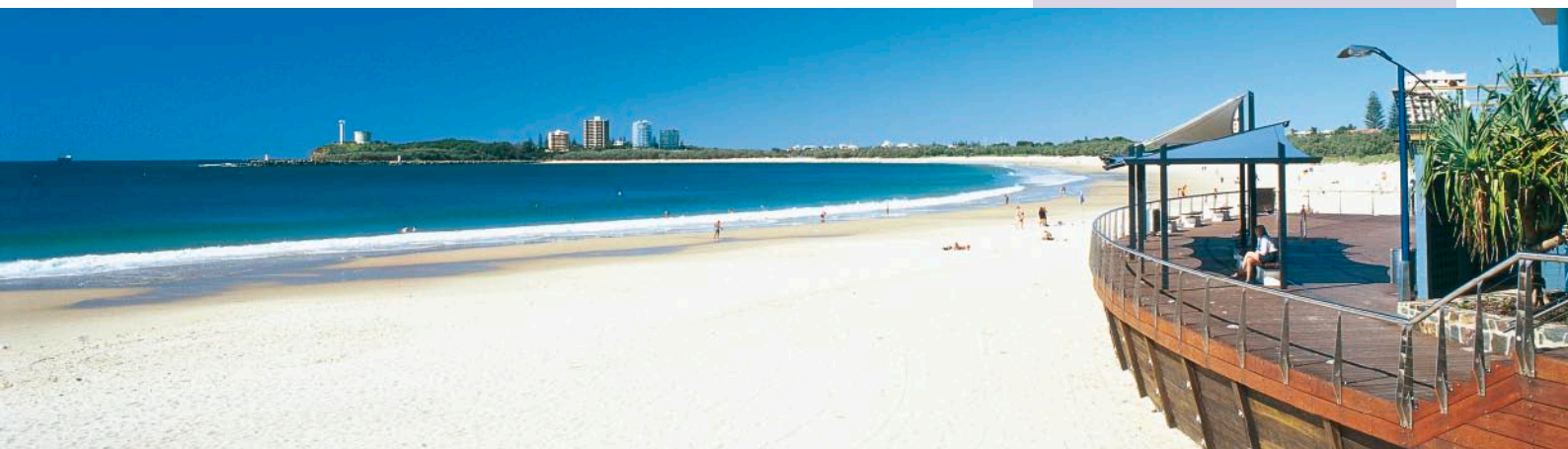

SHORT COURSE FOR ADVANCED TRAINEES IN RESPIRATORY MEDICINE – YEAR 9

Friday 19 and Saturday 20 March

The extremely popular Advanced Trainees Course will again be run in conjunction with the ASM, and will be open to all Advanced Trainees who wish to attend.

Participants must be TSANZ members (one year's membership fees must have been paid in order to qualify) and pre-FRACP (but post Part 1). The cost is \$275 (GST incl) and payment must be forwarded to the ASM Secretariat using the form in this brochure. Attendance at the ASM is not required for attendance at this course.

The course is designed on a 3 year cycle to cover major topics in Respiratory Medicine relevant to the advanced trainee. The forthcoming course will also be designed to be complementary to the recently instituted Lung School teleconference program. Although not yet finalised, speakers will include both Australian and New Zealand experts. Where possible, sessions will be interactive with the use of responder pads. The course is organised by Advanced Trainees to cover their areas of educational need - we look forward to seeing you in Brisbane.

SHORT COURSE FOR RESPIRATORY RESEARCH

Saturday 20 March

This course is organised by the TSANZ Education and Research Subcommittee to provide attendees with essential information on commencing, developing and maintaining a career in respiratory research. The program will cover areas of interest to PhD students and research assistants as well as early and mid-career postdoctoral researchers, and complements the Short Course for Advanced Trainees, which has primarily a clinical focus.

The cost is \$150 (GST incl) for TSANZ members and \$200 (GST incl) for non-TSANZ members and payment must be forwarded to the ASM Secretariat using the form in this brochure. Attendance at the ASM is not required for attendance at this course.

Although not yet finalised, expert speakers will cover planned topics on career development as well as on funding, presenting and publishing your research. Dr Martin Miller
University Hospital Trust,
Birmingham, UK

Martin Miller graduated from St Bartholomew's Hospital, London in 1975 with MBBS and entered research in 1980 completing an MD about time domain analysis of the spirogram. He was appointed Senior Lecturer in Respiratory Medicine at the University of Birmingham in 1988 working as Honorary Consultant Physician at Good Hope Hospital, Sutton Coldfield. He moved to the University Hospital Trust, Birmingham in 1996 and was then Director of Education for the undergraduate medical course. He is chair of two British Standards Institute groups which have produced separate ISO standards for measuring PEF and for recording spirometry. He has been principal author for the most recent ATS/ERS Standards documents for spirometry and is on the ATS/ERS Occupational Spirometry Task Force. Martin was also a co-author of the 6th edition of Lung Function by JE Cotes.

Paul has worked as a respiratory scientist for more than 25 years, working at the Alfred Hospital, Repatriation General Hospital, Austin Hospital and the Royal Children's Hospital. He is currently the Head Scientist and Business Manager of the Department of Respiratory & Sleep Medicine at Monash Medical Centre and Dandenong Hospital. Paul is a life member of the ANZSRS and was President from 1998-2000. He is currently on the Board of the ANZSRS during its governance review and structural change. He lists the Sydney Swans premiership in 2005 as his greatest life achievement.



Dr Paul Older
Melbourne University & Swinburne
University of Technology,
Melbourne

Paul Older commenced his medical training at Guys Hospital London, moving to Australia in 1967. He worked at the Royal Prince Alfred Hospital in Sydney and the School of Underwater & Hyperbaric Medicine with the Royal Australian Navy. In 1982 he commenced at the Western General Hospital, setting up the Cardio-pulmonary assessment service.

He developed an interest in the use of cardio-pulmonary exercise testing in the pre-operative assessment of patients and is widely published in this area. He has also written the "History of the measurement of oxygen uptake", from Lavoisier in 1783, through to the breath by breath analysis used today.

Dr Older was appointed Executive Director of the International Society of Exercise Intolerance, Research & Education (ISEIRE) in 2005.



Dr Sandra Anderson
Sydney Medical School, University
of Sydney

Sandra is a physiologist and studied at the Universities of Sydney (BSc) and London (PhD, DSc). She did her initial training in Respiratory Physiology in Dr Julius Comroe's laboratory, and later her PhD with Dr Simon Godfrey in London. Her major contribution has been in the field of asthma particularly the application of measurement to its diagnosis and treatment. Her studies in asthma led to the commercial development of a rapid test for identifying asthmatics involving the inhalation of mannitol. Sandra is well known in the field of measurement, management and mechanisms of exercise-induced asthma. She serves on the International Olympic Medical Commission independent panel for asthma (2001-2009). She is a Fellow of the ANZSRS, and a Life Governor of Asthma NSW. She grows olives for oil and likes opera and theatre.



Dr Deborah Yates
St Vincent's Hospital, Sydney

Deborah Yates is a Respiratory Physician in the Department of Thoracic Medicine at the St Vincent's Hospital in Sydney and a Conjoint Associate Professor at UNSW.
